

## Labrix Clinical Services

Labrix is a hormone and neurotransmitter testing laboratory. They test sex hormones, melatonin, and diurnal cortisol levels using saliva and neurotransmitters using urine. In addition, they offer DNA analysis for weight issues.

Labrix states that “each person’s hormone and neurotransmitter levels are very individualized. One-size-fits-all medications and hormones rarely suit the vast majority of people. Knowing your hormone and neurotransmitter levels is a critical first step in restoring balance. Understanding what is going on with your body is fundamental to knowing how to make the right changes to restore your energy, your health and your hope for the future”.

Melatonin is the primary hormone (and also functions as a neurotransmitter) associated with sleep patterns. A disruption in melatonin levels can manifest in a variety of sleep concerns including difficulty falling asleep, difficulty staying asleep and chronic insomnia. This hormone is measured in saliva and can be added to a neurotransmitter and or sex hormone profile as well.

You can pre-pay, which offers significant saving off of the list pricing, or you can have Labrix submit to insurance on your behalf. You will receive a receipt and superbill if needed to submit to your insurance and or HSA.

If Labrix submits, Labrix is an out-of-network provider and it is likely that not all charges will be paid by your insurance company. Patients are encouraged to verify coverage prior to testing. If you do not have out of network coverage the tests will not be covered.

The tests will be submitted at list price, patients are responsible for any difference between the List Price and what your insurance company actually pays. The difference or the full list price payment is due within 60 days whether or not the insurance carrier has responded.

Medicare and Medicare advantage plans currently do not cover saliva testing and an Advanced Beneficiary Notice (ABN) is required for this portion of the test. Advanced payments for saliva portion of the test is required.
